2014 marks the 20th anniversary of the Maple Ridge Bandstand. This iconic fixture in Memorial Peace Park on 224th Ave in Maple Ridge is used for musical performances, city events, movie shoots, special festivals and many more events.

Designed and engineered by local trombonist, Tom Walker, the Bandstand was financed primarily with private and corporate donations. Under his project management, local citizens and band members donated thousands of volunteer hours to build this centrepiece in the Maple Ridge downtown core. Upon completion, this bandstand was gifted to the District of Maple Ridge in 1994 by the Maple Ridge Concert Band – a community non-profit organization of 67 years.

A recent inspection determined that the Copper Roof has blackened unnaturally due to environmental conditions and will require cleaning and treatment in order to obtain the antique patina look crucial for copper surfaces. Other patina structures within our province include: Hotel Vancouver, the Parliament Buildings and the Empress Hotel in Victoria.

The Maple Ridge Concert Band needs your support! Funds collected will go directly towards the refurbishment of the Copper Roof estimated approximately \$50,000.00. Fundraising efforts will be administered by the Maple Ridge Concert Band in coordination with Municipal Parks and Leisure Recreation Service. A detailed report and updates will be available upon request.
